Goals and Objectives:

1. Inspire physicians to specialize in diagnosis and treatment of the single most overlooked and serious etiology of spinal pain and impairment; The S/C Syndrome.
2. Share expertise in spine cases, focusing on the Occipital/Cervical and Lumbo/Pelvic regions.
3. Introduce Ethical and Effective Management of the SacroCoccygeal Syndrome including: CaseHistory, Physical Examination, Diagnosis, Patient Selection, Treatment and Outcomes.
4. Establish ethical fee structure for the SacroCoccygeal Syndrome Specialist

The Internship:

Dr. Kemper schedules up to two physicians, therapists or chiropractors at a time to follow him in clinical rounds. Each doctor observes, charts and or assists (depending on licensure), in all phases of history, examination, diagnosis, patient selection, consultation, therapy, treatment, re-evaluation, record keeping, case study production, referral and discharge.

The internship lasts for one week during which time the visiting physician assists in management of patients who arrive from all over the country and world fly seeking competent diagnosis and skilled treatment of their pelvic floor injury resulting in the S/C syndrome.

Training

Doctors receive either didactic and supervised “hands on” clinical training depending on licensure. The intern will be included in the Kemper/Wooley directory of preferred physicians after he or she has attended both the accredited seminar at Palmer College and has successfully treated 3 cases under supervision. The intern will be provided with written and oral testing/assessment after training/supervision is complete.

Note: More than one week may be necessary to become proficient. No formal certificate or fellowship is available at this time.

- Dr. Kemper has successfully treated over 1000 cases where the SacroCoccygeal Syndrome was misdiagnosed by leading Orthopedists, Neurologists, Physiatrists, Anesthesiologists specializing in pain management, Gynecologists and Chiropractors. In each case physical signs and symptoms were present but overlooked, leaving the patient with chronic pain and impairment, until correct diagnosis and treatment was provided.
- Having practiced for 28 years, having participated in original research on the SacroCoccygeal Syndrome, having helped pioneer advancements in diagnosis and treatment of spinal dural tension, Dr. Chris Kemper is wellqualified to assist both young and established physicians improve their diagnostic skills and develop a more satisfying, productive and prestigious practice in this specialty.
- Dr. Kemper's internship weighs heavily on providing ethical management of chronic pain patients. He has a keen perspective regarding patient selection and differential diagnosis. - Doctor Kemper understands that treatment of the S/C syndrome is not for everyone but he emphasizes that diagnosis of the S/C Syndrome, when present, *is essential* for every spine physician to recognize.
